LOOKING TO GIVE their master bath a much-needed facelift, these homeowners wanted to keep the bath's original footprint but not much else. To get the job done, they enlisted general contractor Alfred Navarro of Navarro Construction, Inc., and designer Dan Ricketts of DJR Design Group.

To provide needed privacy in the space, one of the first changes the team made was to frame in the water closet. The previous water closet was open and exposed, creating an eyesore for the homeowners to be greeted with each morning. In addition to being more aesthetically pleasing, the new layout also allows both homeowners to use the bathroom at once. Another major improvement was the replacement of a fixed window on the south side of the room. The team installed a beautiful JELD-WEN casement window in its place.

Known for their signature touches, Ricketts and Navarro outfitted the baseboard, wainscoting, and chair rail with

waterworks tile. The 3-inch-by-6-inch tile had to rise up to meet the top of the vanity and carry throughout the entire room in order to also work with the backsplash behind the sink area. They had the tile cut for the outlets both in the tile baseboard and the tile backsplash.

The team brought in a few LED light strip components, both around the perimeter of the custom fabricated mirrors as well as in the shower at the floor level. In anticipating the need to change out old bulbs, they custom fabricated a plastic sleeve that the LED light strip fits in. This plastic sleeve was installed behind the glass tiles that are used in the shower. Ambiance aside, comfort was also considered, so radiant heating warms the flooring throughout the room—another touch of luxury in this reimagined room. «
